

RICHARD ALLEN Manhasset H.S. 1930-33

The more things change the more they stay the same. That saying applies to Lacrosse too. . .Well doesn't it? Just ask Mr. Allen. He was the first captain of the 1932 Manhasset Lacrosse Team. His coach was the man who started it all, the late Jason Stranahan, the founder of Lacrosse in Manhasset and responsible for the game getting started on Long Island.

Mr. Allen likes to reflect on his memory of this great sport: The only equipment the school provided were the balls. (See things haven't changed that much after all). If you lost a ball the game would stop. . . everyone helped to find the ball. "We had to buy our own wooden sticks \$12.00. . . Which was alot of money in the

Depression." So Mr. Allen has stated.

There were no other lacrosse teams on the Island at that time. Manhasset would play prep schools along the Hudson River and very large schools in Brooklyn. He remembers one game in Brooklyn where they played a game where an old half buried railroad track ran across the field. That was one of the games where we only had nine players show up to play. We had to borrow a player from the other team to play the game. We very rarely ever had substitutes.



Congratulations Mr. Allen and Thank You for your contribution to Manhasset's Lacrosse tradition. We've come a long way.

THE MANHASSET LACROSSE HALL OF FAME LOSES THREE OF IT'S MEMBERS



BILL MacGOWAN..... Manhasset H.S. 1969-72


Bill is considered one of our top midfielders because aside from being a great player he also demonstrated great self control and sportsmanship on and off the field. He was a consistent offensive threat while playing great defense (which can often times be an after thought for many midfielders). Bill was the steady all around player that you would depend on to get the job done which earned him All County Honors his senior year.

After graduation Bill spent two years at Nassau Community College. There he continued his great team play and was voted All Junior College and helped lead his team to a national Junior College Championship.

The next two years Bill transferred to the University of North Carolina. There he really passed the test of being a great player. Despite the fact that his own coach really didn't like him at all, Bill was voted to the All American Team his senior year. This was a great accomplishment because his coach wouldn't even put him up for the award. It was the opposing coaches that voted him in. He also played in the North South All Star Game.

I think we should give him an extra warm congratulations tonight.

SABRINA GALLAGHER ROSZKO Manhasset H.S. 1985-88

Sabrina was the single player to have competed on the only 2 Manhasset Girls Lacrosse State Championship teams, making history for herself. In 1985, as a freshman, she earned a start as a Defense Wing mainly for her speed and phenomenal agility.

Sophomore through senior years, Sabrina held the 3rd Home position, providing skill, speed and determination in the critical midfield connection. She was a record high scorer boasting 169 goals and 69 assists in only 3years. As a sophomore she was named All-League, and later she became a two time All-County and High School All-American. She also was the Captain of the 1988 State Championship Team.

Sabrina went on play at Loyola College where she was coached by Diane Aitkens. She again repeated her status as a two time All-American, where she was termed "one of the biggest scoring threats in Loyola history". She did indeed make history, as she ranks sixth on the all time goal list with 127 goals.

Sabrina's accolades went on further as she was named to the All-South Atlantic team for 4 years. In addition she was named All-Conference for 4 years and once again was recognized for her leadership as a Senior Captain, and participant in the North/South All-Star game.

Possible one of her greatest moments in lacrosse was Loyola's berth to the final four her sophomore year, where they beat Virginia 13-7 in the semi-finals, yet fell to Maryland in the finals 10-5.

Sabrina's induction tonight truly marks the finest of players in ability and sportsmanship.

CAROL RAINSON ROSE..... Manhasset H.S. 1979-82

Fortunately for Manhasset, Carol was a starting Freshman on the 1st Varsity Girls Lacrosse team in 1979. Not only was she a phenomenal lacrosse player but an outstanding athlete as well, playing 4 years Varsity Basketball and 2 years Varsity Volleyball. She was one of the pioneers that started the growth and respect of Girls lacrosse at Manhasset.

Each year, starting on attack, Carol seemed to have scored goals in every game she played. She ended with a career recorded 164 goals and yet because Manhasset was so young, she received a mere All-League status.

Carol went on to be an All-American at SUNY Cortland. During her career there she was honored for the player with the most goals and assists, and was the first female lacrosse player to achieve 100 total goals in Cortland's history.

Carol like many former players has moved on to coach and has been an integral part in Northport's start and tremendously successful program. Within 10 years, she has over 100 victories under her belt and has been the Suffolk County, Long Island and Regional Champion for the past 3 years.

We are honored to add Carol to the list of Manhasset's finest lacrosse players.

CHRIS CORIN MANHASSET H.S. 1974-77

Chris is another fine example of the aggressive, well balanced, attackman to play at Manhasset H.S. Chris was an excellent dodger who could attack the goal thus scoring or drop a perfect pass off to the open man after drawing a second defender. He was voted All North Shore his senior year and helped lead Manhasset into the County Final game.

After graduation Chris went onto the University of Massachusetts. There he was one of the all time leading scorers. Skip Vosburgh, another Manhasset Hall of Famer was Chris' Feeder and the other half of the High scoring Tandem. Chris graduated from University of Massachusetts in 1981 and received All- New England and All American honors that year.

We are proud to have Chris join the ranks of our other great Hall of Fame Attackman. Congratulations.

JUSTIN TORTOLANI...... Manhasset H.S. 1985-88

Justin was in a 3 year Varsity Player at Manhasset. His position was Crease Attack, where he was to hang out in front of the goal and use his size and strength to get open, receive a pass and score. That's exactly what he did. His sophomore and Junior years he was the leading goal scorer. As captain of the team his senior year he scored 65 goals, made the All County Team and helped lead Manhasset to the State Championship game where they were upset by Cortland.

After graduation Justin went to Princeton University where he kept on scoring goals wile achieving academic excellence. Justin became the all time goals scorer at Princeton with 120 goals. He was captain of the team his junior and senior years leading them to a National Championship in 1992 when he was voted the most valuable player. He was voted to the All-Ivy and All American Teams twice. But he was most proud to be one of 17 athletes nominated to the GTE Academic All-American Team. Posting a 3.71 grade point average in Molecular Biology. By the way he was one of two in the nation to do it two years in a row.

Congratulations to Justin for such a Stellar High School and College Career.

BOB ERNST Manhasset H.S. 1965-68

Bob was an outstanding Defensive player at Manhasset. He used his size and strength to intimidate the opposition and using his excellent stickwork, agility and finesse he would steal the ball and get it up field quickly to create an offensive opportunity. In his junior year Bob was a starter for the 1967 Varsity Lacrosse Squad. He represents the seventh person involved with that team to be inducted into this Hall of Fame. He helped lead the team to a perfect undefeated season of 18 and 0 which is a record that has never been matched in the history of Manhasset Varsity Lacrosse. In Bob's senior year he started the entire season winning a League Championship and earning All North Shore Honors.

After graduating from Manhasset Bob went to College at Cortland, where he had an outstanding career playing defense. His senior year he was voted as the most outstanding Upstate Lacrosse Player, helped lead his team to a N.C.A.A. Championship, was selected to play in the North/South All Star Game and earned All American Honors.

Bob has been teaching Physical Education in the Darien Ct. School District for the past 3 years and has as many winning seasons as the Junior Varsity Lacrosse coach. He is credited for helping Darien become a lacrosse powerhouse in the state of Connecticut.

Congratulations Bob and we'll be looking for you at next years "Sound Challenge" game to be held at Garden City.


