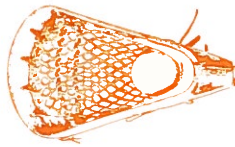

SGT. JAMES REGAN

It is a special honor for the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame to induct Sgt. James Regan.

Sgt. Jimmy Regan was a product of our Manhasset PAL Lacrosse program. The photo below shows him with his teammates on his 4th grade PAL team. He wears number 35 and was coached by Harry Baugher and Bill Martocci, also members of the Hall of Fame.

Jimmy went on to play at Chaminade High School, where he was a 2 year all league player. He was voted captain of his team in 1998 while being elected to the Catholic All American team.

Jimmy attended Duke University with a lacrosse scholarship and made the all ACC Academic Team all 4 years. He was a member of the 2001 and 2002 ACC Championship teams and made a final four appearance in 2002.

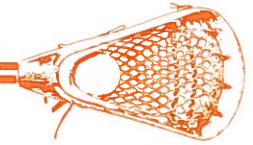
After graduating from Duke, Jim turned down a great job offer and a scholarship to law school. Instead he enlisted in the army and became a member of an elite unit of the Army Rangers. Sgt. Regan, in his fourth tour of duty (two in Afghanistan, two in Iraq) was killed in combat on February 9, 2007.

The memorials at his funeral described a truly special young man who demonstrated his character and

commitment to doing the right thing in every aspect of his life. Teachers, coaches, teammates and friends speak of his intelligence, inner strength, selflessness and sense of humor. There is no more deserving inductee, whose supreme sacrifice Manhasset will never forget.

HARRY L. BAUGHER

Tonight we want to pay tribute to and honor the memory of Harry L. Baugher. Harry died of cancer on January 18, 2007. Harry was one of the driving forces behind so many aspects of Manhasset Lacrosse and this Lacrosse Hall of Fame.

Harry was a player at Manhasset High School and was coached by Rich Moran and Renzie Lamb. He played on the Great LIAC Club team for 11 years. Harry was inducted into this Hall of Fame in 1995.

Harry was a true gentleman and an individual who touched nearly everyone associated with Manhasset Lacrosse over several decades. Proudly, he was able to succeed to the task and high standards of his father W. Harry Baugher who was one of the first coaches of the PBC travel lacrosse program.

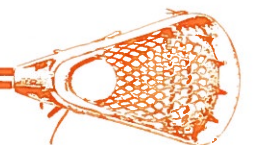

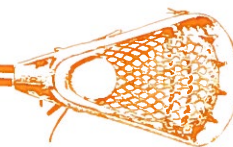

The necessary qualifications of this award are the same ideals both coaches believed in and stressed to the PAL/PBC players that they coached. Their passion and commitment to all athletic competition will never be forgotten.

COACHES



ALAN LOWE

After serving an apprenticeship as the junior varsity coach at East Meadow, Al Lowe became Manhasset's head lacrosse coach for the 1975 season. Al maintained this position for the next 32 years, retiring after the 2006 season. During this time period, Al was at the helm for over 500 victories, 5 state finals and two state championships. In 2004, Al led Manhasset to its second undefeated season, winning the New York State Championship and the number one ranked lacrosse team in the nation by Laxpower and Lacrosse Magazine. His average yearly record over 32 years was an incredible 15 wins versus 3 losses. During his tenure, Manhasset Lacrosse continued the tradition of excellence established by his predecessors by emphasizing lacrosse and academics. Manhasset lacrosse players have gone on to virtually every college in the nation that plays lacrosse. As a player, Al, a Hempstead graduate went on to star at the University of Maryland, teaming up with two of Manhasset's own Jack Heim and Steve Lavoute to form one of the most devastating attack units in lacrosse history. He then starred on the the Long Island Lacrosse Club and was picked to play on the 1974 USA lacrosse team. His fellow players on the USA team acknowledged his leadership skills and elected him captain of the team. Al is a member of the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame.

PAM MONFORT MCDONOUGH

In the fall of 1978, a young lacrosse player from Port Washington and Springfield College arrived at Manhasset to coach, among other sports, Manhasset's first Varsity Girl's Lacrosse team. Although Manhasset had fielded club teams in the past, following the Manhasset unprecedented tradition were large shoes to fill.

In the lean years of girls lacrosse at Manhasset, players saw the transition of a "wooden stick" to a "molded head" stick. Manhasset was the first varsity program to be allowed to use an original prototype designed by none other than our own Bob Rule. The change of stick proved to be one of the huge factors in developing the girls' game to the present day capabilities, and saw girls playing harder, stronger and faster.

Coach Monfort was an integral part of this lacrosse "movement". In the mid '80s girls saw the opportunity to elevate their abilities by attending camps and challenging established programs in Nassau County. In 1982, the first Manhasset player was recruited to attend Dartmouth College and again in 1985 to William and Mary, and the rest is history. In 1986, under Coach Monfort, the team won its first State and Long Island Championship and repeated that quest again in 1988. In all, Coach Monfort's win/loss record ended upon her retirement in 1995, at 191 wins , 76 losses and 7 ties.

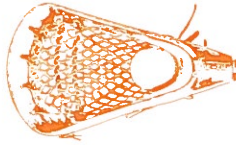
Coach McDonough is presently the girls director in Port Washington where she coaches her daughters, Kelly (12 years) and Erin (10 years).

TOM CAMPOLETTANO

Tom Campolettano (from here on he will be referred to as Tom or Campi) started his coaching career at North Shore High School with boys lacrosse. There, he compiled a record of 79 wins and 54 losses with 8 straight playoff appearances.

In 1999, Campi moved over to Manhasset High School to coach the Girls' Varsity Lacrosse team. Once at Manhasset, he was able to make a smooth transition from coaching boys to girls to maintain a strong and highly competitive girls' program. From 1995-2005 Tom compiled a record of 110 wins, 22 losses and 4 ties. Tom lead Manhasset girls to 3 Long Island Championships, and in 2003 they were New York State Champions. Tom was voted Nassau County Coach of the Year in 2001 and Newsday Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2004.

In 2006, Campi was hired to start the Molloy College women's program. Tom has been an assistant Manhasset Varsity Football coach since 1993 to the present time.



COACHES

RICHIE MORAN

Richie Moran is a Sewanhaka graduate, University of Maryland graduate, and the man who ushered in the golden age of Manhasset Lacrosse. He arrived in 1963 and immediately set about stamping his signature on the Manhasset Lacrosse program. Lacrosse had seen years of mediocrity until Richie arrived. His first priority was to create a team whose work ethic would be second to none. Using his marine training, he created teams that were known for their physical and mental toughness. He took a boys' team and turned it into a men's team. Everyone who played for Richie has stories about how hard they worked for him and how much they learned about lacrosse and life from him. The mark of this man is that even though he only coached for three years here, at Manhasset, he left his indelible mark on the program. He established the tradition of excellence that continues to this day. His record speaks for itself.

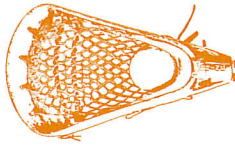
RENZIE LAMB

In 1996, a young Chaminade graduate, Hofstra graduate and former marine officer named Renzie Lamb arrived to take over the varsity lacrosse position for Richie Moran. He knew he had some big shoes to fill after Richie's tenure, but he had been the freshmen coach under Richie, so he knew many of the players he was about to coach. Renzie blended his own coaching style while keeping the philosophy of hard work. He kept Manhasset among the best teams in the nation during his three year tenure from 1966 to 1968. In 1967 he coached a team of fifteen players to an 18-0 record and the Long Island Championship. This team is one of the only two teams to go undefeated in modern Manhasset Lacrosse history. Renzie left Manhasset to become the head lacrosse coach at Williams College after winning the division championship in 1969. Renzie recently retired from Williams College after a long successful career as the varsity lacrosse coach and assistant football coach. The current lacrosse field at Williams is named in honor of Renzie.

TOM POSTEL

One of the greatest players ever to play the game, Tom Postel, a C.W. Post graduate, arrived in 1969 to take over for Renzie Lamb as the new head coach at Manhasset. He promptly put his imprint on Manhasset Lacrosse, turning out innovative high powered offensive teams. Tom's tenure was marked by a combined record of 79 wins and only 22 losses and two division championships. Among his many honors as a player was to be named a captain of the USA team in 1974 and induction into the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame. Tom left Manhasset and served as the successful head coach at C.W. Post for many years.

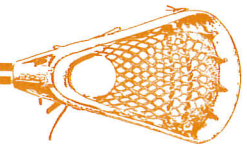
