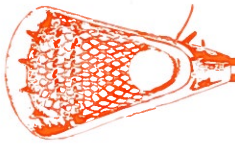

## PLAYER/COACH

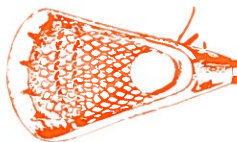
### **BRIGID LYNCH** **M.H.S. 1996-1999**

Brigid Lynch graduated from Manhasset High School in 1999, where she was named All-County for both Lacrosse and Field Hockey. She was a member of the Long Island Schoolgirls Team, both 1998 and 1999 and was an integral part of the 1998 Gold Medal Empire Lacrosse Team.

Brigid Lynch graduated from Hobart and William Smith Colleges in 2003, where she was a member of both the Lacrosse and Field Hockey team. Brigid was a two time All-American and was named Inside Lacrosse 2003 Division III Defensive Player of the Year. She was also named Regional All-American and All-UCAA three years.

Brigid led her team to three appearances in the NCAA tournament, and one of those years was to the final four. In Field Hockey, she was named Regional All-American and AllOUCAA both in 2001 and 2002. She also was a member of the 2000 National Championship Team.

Brigid is currently teaching special education for the New York City Board of Education, and is in her seventh year as the assistant varsity Lacrosse and Field Hockey coach at Manhasset High School.

### **PAL/BAUGHER ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD**

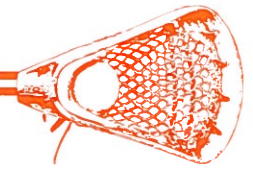

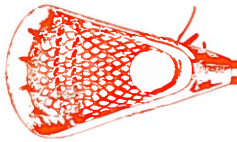
## **E. WARD BITTER** **M.H.S. 1975-1977**

Ward began playing lacrosse soon after moving to Manhasset, N.Y. in 1961 at the age of 6 years old. He first began playing lacrosse in 4th grade with Evan Vosburgh, Ralph Baugher, John Snodgrass, Jay Monahan, and Roger Hueglin as after being invited by Jason Stanahan, one of the key persons who brought lacrosse to Long Island, to play with the 5th and 6th graders on Memorial Field. Ward's father, Edwin W. Bitter, Sr., was in love with the sport while attending Duke University and was a member of the same fraternity as the university's lacrosse players. He in turn, passed the love of the sport onto his son, E. Ward, Jr.

Ward continued to play on Memorial Field, the Village Green, PBC Lacrosse under the master tutelage of Harry Baugher, Sr. during his junior high school years until he graduated to Canterbury High School. During Ward's freshman and sophomore years at Canterbury, he lead the school's lacrosse team in scoring and assists. He then returned back to Manhasset to play on their varsity team as a junior and senior. Although Ward played in a defensive midfield position as the teams were stacked, both years the team lost to Garden City in the County Championships by one goal.

After graduating from high school, Ward attended Boston College, where he was an excellent scorer and clever ball-hander. He led the nation in scoring for 9 out of 10 weeks, finishing second in the scoring title race as a senior and averaging 4.0 goals per game. He totalled 44 goals and 18 assists in 11 games during his senior year. As a midfielder and attacker, Ward accounted for 148 points during his superb varsity career and was named All-American, First Team All-New England and NE Most Valuable Player and was selected for the Northeast All Star Team. He was also named to the East-West and North-South All American All Star Games and was inducted into the Boston College Varsity Club Athletic Hall of Fame in 1987.

## **TIM GOETTLMAN** **M.H.S. 1993-1996**

Tim Goettelmann has been simply unstoppable in his lacrosse career. Nicknamed "Monster", the big attackman can often be intimidating to opponents. At present he is 6' 4" and 215. Pounds that is intimidating. But it all started with the Manhasset pal where tim was coached by, Hall of Famers, Harry Baugher, Tom Nicosia, Bill Martocci and Irwin Klein.

He was a 3 year varsity player at MHS and made All County Honors his junior year and was an All American his senior year. Tim also played on the 1995 New York State Championship team.

Tim went to Loyola College (MD) after Manhasset. He set a school record scoring 77 goals in a single season at Loyola, where he was a two time All-American.

After Loyola tim was drafted by the Long Island Lizards where he holds the MLL record for most goals scored in a game, scoring nine goals against New Jersey. He averaged 26 goals per year with one of the best shot percentages in the league. He has delighted fans with his divings scores, 231 goals and 84 assists while making the All Star Team 3 times in a nine year career. Everyone should come out and see Tim and the Lizards play at Hofstra with some of the best lacrosse players in the world.

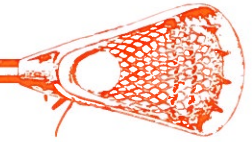
## **TRISH REDDINGTON GRADY** **M.H.S. 1986-1989**

Trish started playing lacrosse at Manhasset Jr. High School. She was fortunate enough to be friendly with Diane Whipple, a member of this Hall of Fame. Diane taught her the fundamentals of the game and even helped her get into shape to make her a better player at an early age. That helped Trish to be a 4 year Varsity player at Manhasset. She was a member of the 1988 N.Y. State championship team, earned all county honors her senior year and was the third highest goal scorer in Long Island History at the time of her graduation.

Trish went on to Lehigh University with a full scholarship for lacrosse and was a 4 year varsity player there as well.

After college Trish coached 7th and 8th grade Manhasset girls for 4 years. Trish always loved Manhasset and the integrity of fair play she found here when she played lacrosse. She now resides in Manhasset with her husband and 2 sons. Trish always said growing up with 4 brothers helped her to be competitive in lacrosse and in life.

Kevin Conway is a lifelong resident of Manhasset and learned to play lacrosse in the Manhasset PBC Lacrosse Program under Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame coaches such as Bill Miller, Joe Fields and Homer Eckerson. He is fortunate to be part of a very rich generation of Manhasset lacrosse players and played in the early precursor to the PAL with more than ten current members of the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame. He was a senior member of the Mergers & Acquisitions Department at Goldman Sachs, advising on a wide range of transactions. Conway also was a Chief of Staff of the Goldman Sachs Investment Banking Division until his departure in 1994 to join Clayton, Dubilier & Rice.

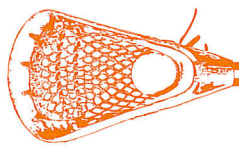

During his business career in marketing with major companies in textiles and sports equipment, he graduated from Regents College with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Marketing and in May, 2000 graduated from Hofstra with a degree in Master of Science in Education. His interest in students was fulfilled when he taught Global History in the New York City school system before retiring.



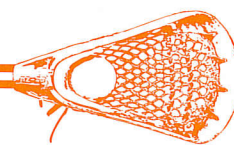
