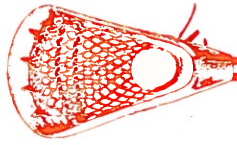

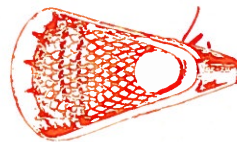


COACH

TOM CAMPOLETTANO

Coach Tom Campolettano certainly left his mark on Manhasset Girls Lacrosse. Tom posted a record of 110-22-4 during his tenure with us. While achieving this, perhaps equally important, he truly instilled love and respect for the game from players, parents, and fans. He led us to Conference Championships in 1999 and 2001, Nassau County Championships in 2003, 2004 and 2005, and Long Island Championships for those same years. Under Tom, we were State Champions in 2003. In his time here, Tom mentored 11 High School All-Americans and was named Newsday's Nassau Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2004.

Prior to his time with Manhasset, Tom enjoyed a similar career also marked with great accomplishments at North Shore High School. In addition to all he has done for secondary school lacrosse, Tom played a major leadership role in the development of the game as past President of the Nassau County Boys Lacrosse Coaches Association and the Metropolitan Lacrosse Foundation, these two organizations representing just a few of the programs he helps. Coach Campi is currently the Head Lacrosse Coach at Molloy College, putting his special touch to that program and taking it to new levels. The Lacrosse Community of Manhasset will always be truly indebted and thankful for the impact he had on our players.

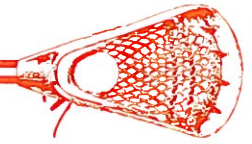
CONOR DENIHAN **M.H.S. 1993-1997**

Conor Denihan was selected to play midfield for team Long Island in the Empire State Games in 1995 and 1996, helping the team win two gold medals.

As a freshman, Conor was named to the varsity team at Manhasset High School and as a sophomore he played an integral role in the Indians' first ever New York State Championship. Conor went on to earn All-American honors as both a junior and senior. After high school, Conor received a scholarship to play at Johns Hopkins University where he became a two-time All-American and was Johns-Hopkins Co-Midfielder of the Year in 2001.

Conor was selected fourth overall in the 2002 Major Indoor Lacrosse League Lacrosse Supplemental Draft. He played four seasons in the MLL, helping the Long Island Lizards win an MLL Championship in 2004. He then joined the New York Athletic Club lacrosse team after the MLL and assisted the team in winning three consecutive U.S. Club Championships. Conor was selected to the All-Decade Manhasset Lacrosse Team for the 1990's He joins his father, Daniel, and his older brother, Daniel Jr., in the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame.

PJ DiCONZA **M.H.S. 1994-1998**

PJ is an example of an outstanding leader and player in the tradition of the Manhasset Indians. His career in high school began with him starting on varsity as a freshman. He was voted All-County as a freshman and sophomore and named a high school All-American in 1997. Raising the bar even further, during high school PJ played on three Empire State Teams, our only lacrosse player to accomplish this in our high school program thus far. PJ's lacrosse accomplishments and selfless contribution continued at JHU. While there, he earned NCAA Division 1 Academic All-American Team II honors, then NCAA Division 1 All-American honors in 2002. JHU also presented him with the Fred Smith Trophy and the Schaffer Award in recognition for his loyalty and dedication to his teammates, along with his outstanding defensive play and team leadership on the field. PJ is certainly a player and a person who took our program to this highest level and is a wonderful role model for our young players of today.

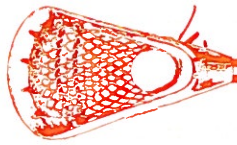
PATRICK GATELY **M.H.S. 1988-1992**

Patrick Gately is a 1992 graduate of Manhasset High School. As a sophomore attackman, Patrick led the Varsity Lacrosse team in scoring and earned All-Conference honors. That summer while attending a lacrosse camp, Patrick tore his Anterior Cruciate Ligament. Patrick spent the following months rehabilitating his knee and earned his way back into the starting lineup. Just prior to playing in his first game, Patrick tore the ACL in his other knee and missed the remainder of his junior year. As a senior, Patrick again worked his way back into the starting lineup. In one of his first games back, he had three goals and one assist in a 5-4 loss to Garden City. He earned All-County honors.

Patrick had a 4 year varsity lacrosse career at the University of Delaware. The Fighting Blue Hens won the North Atlantic Conference title in his first two seasons. As a junior, Patrick was named second team All-Conference following a 24 goal and 11 assist campaign. As a senior, Patrick and fellow Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Famer, Blake Miller, co-led the Conference in points. Patrick's 31 goals and 18 assists earned him First Team All-Conference.

Patrick currently resides in Darien, Connecticut, with his wife and three young sons, and coaches the Darien Lacrosse 7th and 8th grade travel team. He joins his father, Martin, and his sister, Megan Gately Trotta in the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame.

MAGGIE CONNOLLY HEALY **M.H.S. 1995-1999**

Maggie Connolly Healy played 4 years of varsity lacrosse at Manhasset High School. As both a junior and senior, Maggie earned All-County honors. at the Midfield position. In 1999, as a senior, Maggie was selected to be the Captain of her team. In 1998, Maggie was selected to play for team Long Island in the Empire State games, where we went on to win a gold medal.

In addition to lacrosse, Maggie played 2 years of varsity basketball and 3 years of varsity field hockey, where she won a county championship in 1998 and was named a captain and earned All-County honors as a senior.

Maggie had a four year varsity lacrosse career at Brown University in Providence, RI. In 2003, as a senior, she was named captain of the women's lacrosse team and was a recipient of the Brown Leadership Award. She represented the lacrosse team in the Student Athletic Advisory Board.

For the last 8 years, Maggie has coached 7th, 8th and 9th graders in both lacrosse and field hockey at the Green Vale school in Old Brookville.

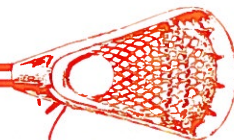
JULIA SOUTHARD **M.H.S. 1998-2001**

ANGELA MILLER MEMORIAL AWARD

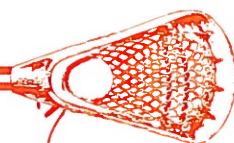


ANGELA MILLER MEMORIAL AWARD

PAL/BAUGHER ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

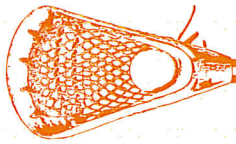

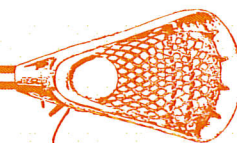
