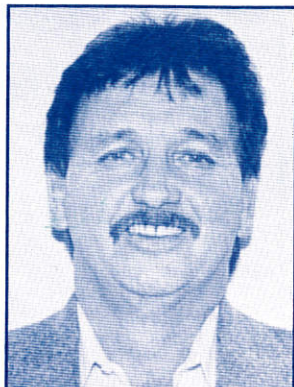

COACH...

Tom Postel

Tom Postel coached at Manhasset High School from 1969 to 1974. While there, he compiled a winning record of 79-23, with 2 North Shore Championships and 4 Division Titles. Tom coached 4 Manhasset graduates who later went on to become college All-Americans. Tom is a member of the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame, who began his legendary career as a two time All-American player at C.W. Post where he is the schools all-time leading scorer. He also won the schools top student-athlete award and Most Valuable Player award. For the past 29 years Tom has been an International Figure in the development of the sport. After graduation, he was one of the top players on the L.I.A.C. Lacrosse team for many years. In 1974 he played on the United States team that captured the World Title in Melbourne, Australia. In 1978 Tom played on the U.S. squad finishing second to Canada in the World Championships at Manchester, England. Manhasset is very proud to have had such a master of this sport teach the game to our athletes.



PLAYERS ...

Gerry Gschwind Manhasset HS 1961-64

Gerry was a 3 year Varsity defenseman at Manhasset in 1962, 63 and 64. Gerry was one of the best man-down defenseman of his time. He used his great physical ability and deceptive speed to fill the gaps left by his penalized teammates. He checked hard and could pick up ground balls and clear them to his midfielders. In his senior year he showed great leadership as captain of the football team and Lacrosse team. He was voted All-County Defenseman in 1964 and helped his team win L.I. Championships in both 1963 and 64. His leadership on the lacrosse field continued at Lehigh University where he was a 3 year varsity player, captain in 1967 and 68, and Most Valuable Player in 1968. Gerry has also helped coach in our PAL Lacrosse programs from 1970-74.

Bobby Goettelmann Manhasset HS 1977-80

Bob was a 3 year Varsity attackman at Manhasset H.S. As an excellent dodger and a tough competitor he would completely dominate his defenseman. Using his great ability to view the whole field, he would always find a way to beat his man either with an assist or a goal. This is why Bob was leading scorer at Manhasset in grades 10, 11 and 12. Bob grew stronger every year. As a sophomore he made All-Division, as a junior he was All-Conference and in his senior year he earned All-County honors and was named to the High School All-American Team. Bobby's offensive dominance continued at N.C. State where he received a full scholarship. Bob holds a number of scoring records at N.C. State where he started every game and helped his team earn their first national ranking and great recognition.

Glen Mueller Manhasset HS 1965-68

Glen was a 3 year Varsity player at Manhasset in football, basketball, and lacrosse. He also earned All-County honors in all three sports his senior year. As an attackman Glen was always a threat to score and his great ability to ride lead to many extra scoring opportunities. One of Glens fondest memories was scoring the winning goal in the 1967 win over Huntington which gave the Indians a perfect 18-0 record and a L.I. Championship. Glen continued showing his great versatility in sports at Cornell University where he was a 3 year starter in basketball and lacrosse. Glen was a key member of the 1971 National Champion team and earned All-American honors that year and again in 1972. After college Glen played lacrosse with the L.I.A.C. and in the Canadian league winning a National Lacrosse Championship with the Quebec City Caribous in 1975. Glen is truly one of the finest athletes Manhasset H.S. has ever known.

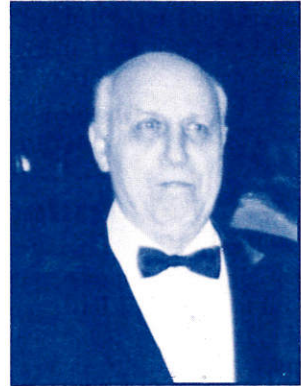
Lee "Skip" Vosburgh Manhasset HS 1975-78

Skip started his lacrosse career very early at Manhasset. What a lot of us remember about "Skipper" was what a great "Ball Boy" he was for our Varsity teams. As a youngster standing behind the goal during our varsity games he developed ball control skills he would later use at Manhasset while playing attack. Controlling the offense was Skip's specialty. He earned All-Division honors in 1977 as he helped his team win the County Championship that year, and in 1978 he was voted All-County. Lee's offensive skills continued at the University of Mass. where he was a 3 year starter. As one of the leading scorers at U. of Mass he earned All-American honors in 1981.

Phil Ruggiero

When you ask yourself what a great community is built around, you'd say its people. When you ask the people from Manhasset what makes Manhasset great, they'd say - **Phil Ruggiero**. Phil was an outstanding athlete when he attended Manhasset High School, and received a baseball-basketball scholarship to St. Michael's College in Vermont. At St. Michael's, he was the only athlete in the school's history to be named captain of two sports in the same season - baseball and tennis. In baseball, he was named to the Green Mountain Conference All-Star Team all four years and the M.V.P. in 1935. Phil still holds the St. Michael's College record for most RBI's in one season with 48. He also captained the basketball team and was named to the All-Conference Team again for all four years. Recently, Phil was honored as an inductee into the St. Michael's College Hall of Fame. You can speak with anyone from five generations, and they will have a story about how Phil has touched their lives in some special way. Stories such as repairing cleats while the player is still in them and donating equipment to those who couldn't afford it are too many to document. He has supported every church, youth, and school organization and all have benefited from his expertise. Phil has always been here for us, and now it is our turn to show our appreciation to Manhasset's #1 Contributor.
